




How is Medicaid funded? Who gets Medicaid?

### What is Medicaid?

- Public health insurance for people with limited incomes
- Also called "Medical Assistance" in Pennsylvania
- Medicaid is a federal-state partnership. It's paid for by both the federal government and Pennsylvania.

# 3 MILLION Pennsylvanians Rely on Medicaid!

Nearly **1 in 4**Pennsylvanians is on Medicaid

**39%** of kids in PA children are on Medicaid.

48% of PA kids with special needs are on Medicaid.

1 in 3 births in Pennsylvania is covered by Medicaid 190,000
Pennsylvanians
rely on Medicaid to
avoid institutions.

Medicaid funds more than 60% of nursing home care in PA.

# Medicaid is the most powerful public health intervention ever.



Pennsylvanians enrolled in Medicaid!

Seniors, People with Disabilities, Pregnant Individuals	991,788	33%	81%
Medicaid Expansion	747,802	25%	11%

#### 1. REPEAL MAJOR BIDEN HEALTH RULES (\$420B)

- 2. STRENGTHEN MEDICARE FOR SENIORS (\$479B)
  - Site Neutral \$146B
  - *Uncompensated Care* \$229B
  - *Bad Debt* \$42B
  - o BCA Mandatory Sequester Extension \$62B

#### 3. MAKING MEDICAID WORK FOR THE MOST VULNERABLE (\$2.3T)

- o Per Capita Caps up to \$918B
- o Equalize Medicaid Payments for Able Bodied Adults up to \$690B
- o Limit Medicaid Provider Taxes \$175B
- o Lower FMAP Floor \$387B
- Special FMAP Treatment for DC \$8B

- o Medicaid Work Requirements \$120B

#### 4. REIMAGINING THE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT (ACA) (\$151B)

- o Appropriate Cost Sharing Reductions \$55B

#### 5. ENDING CRADLE-TO-GRAVE DEPENDENCE (\$347B)

- Reinstate the Trump-era Public Charge Rule -- \$15B
- o Reduce TANF by 10 Percent \$15B
- o Eliminate the TANF Contingency Fund -- \$6B
- o Reform the Thrifty Food Plan -- up to \$274B
- Eliminate the Social Services Block Grant \$15B
- SNAP Reforms \$22B



"Making the pledge to say we're going to find \$2.5 trillion over 10 years, we're gonna have to, I mean otherwise we're gonna bankrupt the country ... I've been a big proponent of **per capita allotments** [in Medicaid]."

"We offered Medicaid reform in reconciliation in the repeal-and-replace package, and it was **per capita allotments**, which didn't cut Medicaid but it does limit the growth."

- House Energy and Commerce Chairman Rep. Brett Guthrie (R-KY) "I think we're going to look for savings wherever we can, and that might include health issues. There's hardly anything except Social Security and Medicare that can't be on the table."

"Block Grants make a lot of sense."

"There's some talk about work requirements and various aspects, but we haven't determined the final parameters of it yet. That'll be a bicameral discussion."

# Medicaid is a partnership. The feds pay some and PA pays some.

## **Block Grants**


States get a single <u>lump sum</u> to cover Medicaid expenses regardless of enrollment or costs of care with minor increases each year.

## Per Capita Caps

States get a fixed amount of money **per person** enrolled in Medicaid that may or may not cover the cost of care with minor increases each year.



## **Budget Reconciliation**

Budget Reconciliation is a tool that gets around the filibuster, so only 51 votes are needed in the Senate, but it's complicated....

- Budget resolution gives instructions to each committee.
- The committees then draft bills that follow those instructions.
- The Budget committee combines all those bills into one budget bill.
- If there are differences between the two chambers they must be resolved.

Right now there are MAJOR differences between the two chambers that will need to be reconciled.





### What Can You Do?

**Call** your federal legislators!

- No cuts or caps for Medicaid
- Extend the Enhanced Premium Tax Credits (EPTC) for the ACA

Share your stories!

- Personal stories make the most impact on legislators
- Meet with your legislators
- Talk to your neighbors, encourage them to get involved











# How would these proposals impact Pennsylvania?

Federal Medicaid cuts mean... **Estimated \$3-4 Billion** cut to Pennsylvania Medicaid (2026)!!!

## Making a Call to Congress: Tips

- Calls are more effective than emails or web forms.
- Make sure you're calling your Representative and Senators!
- Always be polite and courteous.
- Practice what you'll say or write down a few notes.
- Leaving a voicemail is ok. Keep it to 30 seconds or less.
- If the staffer shares any information with you on the call, take note & share it with PHAN!

(Example: "Thank you for calling. Rep. Jones is already planning to vote against Medicaid cuts.")




## Making a Call to Congress: What to Say

- First, give them your name & address. Make sure they know you live in their district!
- Tell them you are concerned about potential cuts to Medicaid.
- Tell them from the heart in 30 seconds or less why Medicaid is important to you or your family.
- Ask them to vote "No" on *any* cuts to Medicaid, <u>including</u> work requirements.
- Call 866-426-2631 to be connected to your Rep. in Congress!
